Discussion Starter

• What is the most valuable thing that you have in your house other than people? How do you treat that thing?

Opening Prayer

• Ask if someone wants to volunteer before leading the prayer.

Tell the Story

Read the Story (Exodus 20:1-26, Exodus 32:1-35)

• Read out loud as a group, 5 verses per person. Let everyone know they can opt out if they would like.

Breaking it Down

 All questions should be utilized as appropriate based upon group dynamics to facilitate both understanding and discussion. Don't feel tied to the questions and don't feel like you have to get through every question. Follow the Spirit's lead! All questions are a matter of perspective in some way BUT there are specific questions that this is truer of and these questions have been indicated to be perspective/opinion questions.

Exodus 20:1-26

- Why does God remind the Israelites where they have come from and what He did for them at the beginning of Exodus chapter 20?
 - He knew that His people would have a tendency to forget although they had experienced great things because of what God had done. Remembering would draw their focus and attention back to what they had seen and experienced.
- What do you think it means for God to be jealous?
- Do you think God being jealous is a good or bad thing? Why?
- Why do you think God is jealous?
 - These are opinion and perspective questions so please listen as the facilitator.



- Do you agree or disagree with the following quote? This is an opinion and perspective question so please listen as the facilitator.
 - "God is jealous for your heart, not because He is petty or insecure, but because He loves you. The reason why God has such a huge problem with idolatry is that His love for you is all-consuming. He loves you too much to share you." Kyle Idelman
- What are some examples of modern-day idols? What modern day idols do you wrestle with the most?
 - This is an opinion and perspective question so please listen as the facilitator.
- Notice the first four commandments have to do with an individual's relationship with God and the final six commandments have to do with an individual's relationships with others. What do you think this says about God?
 - The vertical relationship affects the horizontal relationships and the horizontal relationships affect the vertical. In other words, our individual relationship with God affects our relationships with others and our relationships with others affects our relationship with God.
 - What do you personally find difficult about this if anything?
 - This is a perspective and opinion question so please listen as the facilitator.

Exodus 32:1-35

- Read Exodus 32:1. How are you and I similar to the Israelites when things don't go our way and in our timing?
 - o This is an opinion and perspective question so please listen as the facilitator.
- What does Exodus 32:2-6 say about spiritual leadership?



- Spiritual leadership isn't easy. Rather, it is difficult and intentional. Spiritual leadership isn't primarily concerned about pleasing others and giving them what they want. Rather, spiritual leadership is about pleasing God and giving others what they need.
- How is Moses battling for the souls of the Israelites in Exodus 32:11-14?
 - o This is an opinion and perspective question so please listen as the facilitator.
 - How do you battle for the souls of the following people?
 - Your spouse?
 - Your family
 - Your brothers and sisters in Christ?
 - Your co-workers
 - Those who don't yet know Jesus
 - These are opinion and perspective questions so please listen as the facilitator.
- How do you explain all that God did and said in Exodus 32:27-35 to someone who may believe that God acted harshly?
 - It isn't our job to explain away all of God's actions/thoughts/motives, etc. However, God does take seriously obedience to Him and submission to Him because He cares so passionately for us and loves us perfectly. Our decisions matter to Him and He knows what's best for us and there may be times when His parenting/discipline of us may "seem" harsh, but it is absolutely what is needed.
